Nearly thirty years since it was first produced at the National Theatre, Alan Bennett's stage adaptation of Kenneth Grahame's beloved novel has become a classic in its own right.

Bennett's trademark wry humour reshapes the adventures of Mole, Ratty, Badger and Toad into a witty, warm-hearted tale for young and old. Shamelessly rose-tinted and misty-eyed, this is a delightful romp through a charming Edwardian England that is sure to warm your heart as Spring approaches.

# Who needs reasons when you've got heroin?

17th - 21st April 2018

Starts **7.30pm** Tickets **£14.00** Concession **£11.50**  A gaunt, scrawny gang of anti-heroes - Begbie, Renton, Spud and Co - live life on the edge in 1990's Edinburgh. But their gross-out gags and techno-charged hedonism disguise a bleak, desperate undertow of addiction and ruin.

This adaptation of Irvine Welsh's smash-hit novel about drugfuelled urban alienation speaks as loudly and irreverently as ever. A counter-cultural reaction against Thatcher-era Britain, Trainspotting retains all of its raw energy in exposing the narcotic, dead-end flip side of "loadsamoney" capitalism.

Be prepared for a no-holds-barred, in-your-face cocktail of loud music, bright lights, strong language, and adult themes.

# Eeeh – they'll hear the rumpus about this from here to Leeds!

All three couples were married the same day twenty-five years earlier by the same parson, and their silver wedding celebrations of such important citizens are to be captured for posterity by the photographer of the Yorkshire Argus. But these paragons of bourgeois respectability choke on their sherry when it's discovered that due to an administrative mistake – they aren't actually married!

Priestley throws a playful spanner into the works of Edwardian society, poking merciless fun at the social pretensions of provincial grandees in the England of 1908. The sitting-room doors of the Helliwells' mansion form a perfect arena for farcical comings and goings as middle-class values are hilariously punctured.

Lee Hall's outrageously funny black comedy walks the line between humour and tragedy in a raucous combination of farce, taboo-busting excess, and gross-out satire. First produced at Newcastle's Live Theatre in 1998, Hall's early classic remains a vibrant combination of innocent charm and anarchic energy.

### The work continues
