

Spooks, witches, and evil goblins abound in this richly textured journey down the winding path into the woods.

Originally adapted by the Poet Laureate for the Young Vic in 1994, this combined Youth Theatre/Adult Theatre production recaptures all of the dramatic energy and imaginative power that lies at the heart of these hauntingly magical stories.

Richard Bean's award-winning adaptation relocates Goldini's 18th century Venetian farce to 1960s Brighton, losing none of the knockabout pace and comic momentum on the way. This hilarious romp has swept up plaudits from the West End to Broadway. So come and be swept along with our cast in this heady and intoxicating cocktail of mistaken identity and wise-cracking slapstick.





Waiting for Godot

We always find something—eh, Didi?—to give us the impression we exist...

Two weather-beaten down-and-outs linger by a solitary tree, hoping to meet the elusive and mysterious Mr Godot. Their infernal wait is alternately enlivened by high-velocity banter, lugubrious melancholy, sardonic contemplation, and some very odd visitors and passers-by. At once emotive, contemplative, and humorous, Beckett's masterpiece wittily explores our angst-ridden insecurities on the absurdity and meaninglessness of life.

Hailed by the legendary critic Kenneth Tynan as "a pilgrim from Mars" upon its sensational arrival in 1955, Beckett's existentialist tragicomedy has been a familiar friend to theatre lovers ever since. In recent years, Vladimir and Estragon have become must-do roles for Hollywood stars and jobbing actors alike. Will Godot show up? There's only one way to find out...

by Alan Bennett


One seldom was able to do her a good turn without some thoughts of strangulation.

When Alan Bennett allowed an elderly homeless lady to park her camper van on his driveway, he little imagined she'd stay there for 15 years. This bittersweet epitaph to the enigmatic and cantankerous Miss Shepherd is a wryly humorous account of the writer's strained relationship with this prickly, eccentric, and obstreperous old woman.

Now a successful film, Bennett's play was a huge hit when it premiered at the National Theatre in 1999. Our earlier production of this play in 2007 was its first (and thus far, only) staging in Newcastle, so we are proud once again to present this heartwarming exploration of human kindness, liberal guilt, and a writer's eternal fascination with the quirkier side of life.

Clues, motives, suspects, red herrings—can you help Michael Starkwedder to solve the mystery? This classic whodunit from the masterly pen of Agatha Christie is a sure-fire winter warmer, so book early to get a good seat.



Antigone

by Jean Anouilh Translated by Lewis Galantiere

All you can do, for all your crown and your trappings and your guards, all that you can do is have me killed.

Jean Anouilh wrote his re-imagining of Sophocles' Greek tragedy in 1944 at the height of the Nazi occupation of France. The resulting drama is a heartfelt rebel-yell of defiance, exposing the emptiness and inhumanity of totalitarian regimes. Transformed into a freedom fighter of the French Resistance, the eponymous heroine becomes a living, vibrant, and enduring metaphor for the struggle against fascism.

This classic of French drama was a hit in London when its English language translation premiered in 1949, starring Laurence Olivier and Vivien Leigh. Needless to say, the People's Theatre was the first company to bring it to Newcastle that same year. We are proud once again to give a rare outing to this thoughtful exploration of how to maintain integrity in a world of moral compromise.

Redevelopment update

We are well on our way to completing our redevelopment, transforming a large part of the People's Theatre in our biggest improvement since 1963.

From June 2016 we are building:

- · a truly inspiring, new Studio Theatre space on ground floor level
- · full access to all areas of the venue for wheelchair and mobility restricted users
- · new lighting and heating systems that will reduce our carbon footprint
- an improved exterior and a new foyer, bar, gallery and archive display area.

The funding to make this all possible has come from a wide variety of local and national trusts, a loan from Newcastle City Council, contributions from our members and, not least, from you through your generous donations and continued support as our audience.

All told we have now raised over £1 million!

The fundraising doesn't stop here. We will be continuing to raise much needed funds over the coming months. We urgently need to raise funds to buy kit and equipment for our fantastic new accessible studio.
